recipe: Crock Pot Applesauce

Apples-sliced & peeled ½ cup sugar 1 tsp. cinnamon Water

Put enough water in the crock pot just to cover the bottom of it, not cover the apples. Add apple slices. Add cinnamon and stir. Add mixture to the crockpot. Turn crock pot to high and stir continuously until apples are mushy. Use a masher to mash the apples down into applesauce. Serve warm or cold! 10 Activities to Encourage Preschool Independence:

Teaching and encouraging independence in preschool age children is helpful to their development. Below are a few activities that you can implement at home to help them gain independence. We do most of these at preschool too! The link at the bottom will take you to the article with the rest of the ideas.:

- Pick Out Clothes. This is a great activity to do a night before bed. Fashion battle may happen, but it's a good learning experience for everyone.
- 2. Getting themselves dressed. Children can begin to dress themselves with simple clothes. It may not always be on correctly, but allowing them to do it independently not only helps them grow, but they begin to take pride in their work!
- 3. Setting or cleaning the table after a meal. Giving kids a role in the family meal is not only great for building independence, but it also models the value of everyone pitching in to complete chores.
- 4. **Putting items away when entering the house**. Encouraging children to hang up their coat and put away their shoes when they return home is an easy and quick way to encourage independence. It also teaches them to take pride in their belongings.
